"A DEER DEPENDENCE ON COD"

As we grow and mature as individuals, it is expected that our dependence on our earthly parents will decrease. No more will we hold hands to cross the street, have our curfew decided for us, or expect our expenses to be covered on our behalf.

Conversely, as we grow and mature in faith, we are to *increase* our dependence on Christ. As our understanding of God and scripture grows, we come to understand that we can rely on Him for all things, and are blessed when we do so.

For men, especially, it is difficult to allow this process to unfold. Men are designed to be leaders, in family, in church, and within the community. Our tendency is to take control, not relinquish it.

Jamaal Williams' keynote address at Iron Sharpen's Iron 2018 in Springfield, Illinois, addresses this. "Our call to deep dependence is a topic that has always inspired me," Williams says.

Williams is lead pastor of Sojourn Midtown in Louisville, KY., Williams is pursuing a Doctorate of Educational Ministry in Black Church Leadership from the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. He and his wife, Amber, have five children.

"We'll be talking about what it means to live as a man with a deep dependence on God, Williams says. "What are the benefits of that, what are some of the hindrances, and how does Christ empower us to do that?"

"We're talking about something that helps give our life meaning, and our soul rest. It fosters fruitful relationships with God and with others." Jamaal takes time from his busy family, ministry, and educational life

to speak at ISI because he sees men as the last line of defense in the church. "Satan knows if he can discourage a man, he can discourage a family, a

church, a whole community. That's why events like ISI are so important. These conferences remind us how the Gospel speaks to our brokenness, that there is no condemnation in Christ. He empowers us to live good lives with faith,

Why do we devote such a large portion of our ministry to ISI? Because the impact ISI has on men is huge!

This is carried back to the individual church, which then is poised to have a greater impact in the community.

I talked to a man recently who pastors in a small town. "I just want to confirm the 15 guys we're bringing to ISI this year," he said. "Our church is busting at seams, and God is on the move!"

Praise God, we know He is!
