

THE IMPACT OF RPM

Church Coaching is where RPM lives; where the work is done that assists individual pastors and churches to bring men into discipleship, both as disciples and diciplers. As we continue our MIS-SION100 appeal (a goal of 100 men, families, or churches partnering with RPM at \$80 per month) we present here a first hand account of Church Coaching's impact on one local church....

Solid Rock Chapel

Solid Rock Chapel has been teaming with RPM over the past couple years to help reach every man within our congregation.

Our goal was never to fill the seats in the sanctuary with more men, but rather to equip the men in the congregation. Every church needs men to step up and be the spiritual leaders of their families and sphere of influence if we expect to do what Jesus tells us to do in Matthew 28:19.

Our church has a mission statement, but are we living up to it and applying it? The mission statement for Solid Rock Chapel is to lead people into a growing relationship with Jesus Christ, the rock of our salvation; to disciple people to spiritual

maturity; and to equip them for ministry. We needed a game plan, and help to achieve it.

That is where RPM comes into play. The men's leadership team meets with Tom and Tom quarterly throughout the year and we discuss specifics to Solid Rock Chapel's DNA, as it pertains to maturing our men in Christ.

In addition to the quarterly face to face meeting, Tom and Tom communicate with me via e-mail, text and phone to check in and make themselves available if we have any snags or issues.

The women within our congregation have noticed that the men are stepping up and have reached out to us about what we are doing. We now have a women's leadership team that mirrors the men's team.

So, we are more aligned with our mission statement as a church body and our ministries are working more in harmony to reach the members. Our goal since the beginning was to equip the men into being leaders and in doing so we have reached the husband, father, brother, and son who in turn has reached the wife, mother, sister, and daughter.


