


The youngest of 4 boys, by many years, he couldn't stand up for himself. Feeling excluded and defenseless, emotions turned into inner rage. Mean and violent explosions, when angry, became his only defense. "Everyone in my family had a hot temper, and so did I" says Spangler. This is what he believes triggered his anger issue that would haunt him for decades.

When asked how he had been freed of this life controlling issue he replied "I had to retrain myself how to react, and that took years. I had to dissect my episodes of anger and wedge a bit of sanity in it with specific trigger words". Rick was adamant to say this was a process and it took a long time to get there. He says he still gets upset on occasion and his wife tells him, you need to think about what you said and leaves the room to give him time to think and pray.

Spangler says since getting a grip on the anger, his marriage and family have been transformed, much more peaceful now. He explains "the ability to keep peace in the storm has allowed for a lot less clean up afterward". He states his advice for men is "if you won't do it for yourself, do it for your wife and kids. What you do, your kids will do too".

'It is not what I can get out of the marriage, but what I can give to the marriage. It's not you need to make me happy, but I want to make you happy"
