Meet RPM board member, John Swinford. John and his wife of 33 years, Cari, have 2 married daughters and 4 grandchildren.



Growing up watching the Vietnam War unfold on nightly television, John knew from a young age that he wanted to serve his country and be a veteran like many of the men he looked up to in the small town in Vermillion county where he grew up. "The first time I ever saw my father cry was in 1975, the day I told him I was enlisting into the Marines. My father was supportive of me going into any branch of service other than the Marines." he states.

Swinford held several positions over his military career. An injury that occurred while being in the Infantry required that he re-enlist to serve in a different occupational field. While training to become and Aviation Operations Specialist in 1983, John learned several of his closest friends had been killed in the bombing of the Marine barracks in Beirut. John served in many locations and conflicts including

Beirut, Mogadishu, Bosnia, and Operation Desert Storm. "The Battle of Mogadishu (Blackhawk Down) occurred in October of 1993 and I left for Somalia in December. It was unlike anything else I had ever experienced. Complete anarchy." John explains.

While in Somalia he received orders to escort someone to safety. In complete body armor and fully armed, John answered the call. John explains that the gentleman was visibly not Somalian but African, and can describe him to you as if he were standing in front of him all these years later. "Are you a Christian" this man asks. "Yes, I am. I have been a Christian since I was a young boy", John replies. John goes on to explain that immediately he feels the conviction that only God can bring. Later that night John attended a Bible study and fully recommits his life to Jesus. John explains that although he had accepted Jesus as his savior at a young age, he hadn't really made him Lord. That night, in Mogadishu, John made Jesus Lord over his life and soon felt the call to ministry.

John found out this African man, was actually a missionary from Kenya. "Here I was fully armored up with body armor and armed, but this man....he was clothed only in the full armor of God. God has a way of bringing everything together. All the things I went through in the military, was for this one encounter. He wins, God always wins." John emphatically states.

After serving for 26 years (1975-2001) John retired from the Marine Corps. Swinford went on to attend seminary and is now a bi-vocational pastor of Sweetwater Christian Church in Greenview, IL and is "Lifting up Jesus" throughout central and west central Illinois as station manager for the WLUJ family of stations in Springfield, IL.
